Once lab access is provided by the department, notify the faculty PI of your weekly work
schedule.
Wear appropriate safety gear, at a minimum protective (lab)coats and safety glasses. Wear
close-toed shoes or boots, and tight-fitting, fire-resistant clothing with long sleeves and legs.
Avoid skirts and dresses. Tie long hair. Remove jewelry. Wear appropriate lab gloves at all times

when handling chemicals and glassware. Using protective gear will save you from injury

Clean up spills and dispose of used chemicals and broken glassware in the appropriate
containers. Ask the assistance from Mrs. Yoko Sato, when in doubt of the correct procedure
according to the MSDS sheets.
Report unsafe working conditions, such as unlabeled chemicals, spills of unknown chemicals,
leaks, power outages, fume hood or vent malfunctions, unfamiliar smells or sounds,
immediately to the faculty PI, the chair, Dr. Stefanie Brachfeld, or Mrs. Patti Flatley in ML 252.
Call Facilities at 973-655-5444 for leaks, power short circuits, fire hazards, and other facility
emergencies.
In case of accident or injury in the communal lab notify the nearest person and the department
chair Dr. Stefanie Brachfeld at 973 655-5129. In case of emergency medical attention call 973-
655-5222 for Campus EMS services. Follow the instructions in the CSAM laboratory safety
guidelines and consult your department manager (Dr. Brachfeld) to determine whether or not
