She graduated from Kean College and received a master's degree in education from Montclair State College in New Jersey.

She is a daughter of Marcel Durieux of Nant, France, and the late Yvonne Durieux. The bride's father retired as a mechanical engineer in Drancy, France, for the Bendix Corporation, the auto and truck parts maker and former industrial conglomerate.

Mr. LeBel, 63, is a professor of economics in the business school at Montclair State, where he was previously the dean of the business school and the chairman of the department of economics and finance.
